

Injured Police Officer, Jeremy "Robocop" Romero, Returns to Work

My name is Jeremy Romero.* I sustained an L1 incomplete spinal cord injury during a high speed pursuit while serving on the Corrales Police Department, New Mexico. I have been a ReWalker since 2015.



How do you use your ReWalk?

I can now walk more than two miles at a time in my ReWalk. I could only walk 1000 feet when I started training, but now I walk more in a day than most able bodied people probably do. I am very fortunate that my insurance covered this device, and I am much more financially stable by returning to work.

Have you noticed any changes since you started to use ReWalk?

I am able to use public restrooms now with the use of ReWalk. I was not able to do that before. Since using ReWalk, I no longer use a catheter, so I don't get U.T.I.s (urinary tract infections).

Spasticity used to happen and pain was excruciating. I don't take any pain medication anymore. My pain has reduced and has been almost eliminated since using ReWalk.

Being able to look at people standing up means a lot to me, and my cardio health is tremendous. Getting back to work and having a paycheck is also important. I am able to live like a normal human being and not be in pain all the time.

Do you have any other comments on how ReWalk has affected you?

If I didn't have this ReWalk, I would have pressure sores, dizziness, cardiovascular problems, tremendous daily pain, weight issues, and bladder and bowel function problems.

ReWalk has changed my overall health and wellbeing. I am much healthier due to ReWalk. My activity level is very high, especially by returning to work as a result of this device.
